INTERMEDIATE (B1)

Module 1

With this module, you can:

- Ask for clarification and give basic explanations when something goes wrong.

In professional contexts, this means:

- Explaining rules, responsibilities, and simple procedures.
- Taking part in conversations without needing constant support.

Progress is evidenced when the student:

- Speaks in complete ideas instead of isolated sentences.
- Makes fewer basic grammar errors that affect understanding.
- Can keep a conversation going and be understood without repeating everything.

- Connects ideas logically and speaks with more fluency.
- Self-corrects while speaking instead of stopping
- Responds appropriately to follow-up questions and new information.

- Compare options and give simple reasons for decisions.
- Handle predictable work situations with confidence.

In professional contexts, this means:

- Reporting on meetings and decisions.
- Explaining how tasks or services work.
- Giving feedback and handling basic disagreements politely.
